The focus is on all of the careers that exist in agriculture.


Thank Farmer Thursday

The Next Steps



1. Reading options

- Schedule an in-person reading if your school permits visitors.
- Set up a Zoom session with the classroom teacher and read live to the students at a time you schedule with the teacher. *
- Record yourself reading the book via a free Zoom account. Then send your recording
 to the classroom teacher to view with the students. The Foundation can provide you
 with directions on how to do a Zoom recording. *
- Have your school join in to watch Pennsylvania Farm Bureau President, Rick Ebert, read Chuck's Ice Cream Wish on Friday, March 19, 2021 (time to be determined). The reading will be followed by a Zoom session (registration required) where you will see Chuck's farm. A LIVE question and answer session will follow with Chuck and Rick

2. Communicate with your classroom teacher

- Once you have selected an option for reading the book, you will need to contact the classroom teacher to
 arrange a day and time for either the in-person reading or the alternative Zoom option. If you are reading via
 Zoom, request the teacher's preferred contact information for the Zoom invite that you will later send to
 them.
- Determine if you will would like to do the provided activity (a Cootie Catcher) with the students after you have read the book. If you plan to do the activity, it would be a good idea to notify the classroom teacher that you will be doing a short activity with them after you read the book. Each student will need a pair of scissors for the cootie catcher.
- If you do not plan to do the activity, that is ok and not required. Feel free to share your experiences about agriculture to the students after you have read the book and let them ask you questions too.
- Let your teacher know prior to your visit that the Ag Literacy Week website has numerous resources and activities to go along with the book including a weekly activities schedule. Our weekly activities are a great way for them to incorporate agriculture into their lesson plans for Ag Literacy Week. The website is www.pfb.com/agliteracy.com

3. Get ready to read

- Review Chucks Ice Cream Wish—Tales of a Dairy Godmother and be sure to add your name to the bookplate as the donor of the book to the classroom.
- Contact the classroom teacher **one week** prior to your visit/Zoom to confirm the day and time you previously arranged with them. If you are reading through Zoom, be sure to send your classroom teacher the link a week ahead of time.

In-Person Visit Logistics:

- Report to the school office and arrive at least 15 minutes early to allow time to sign and get to the class-room. Be prepared to have the teacher's name, and a photo ID to get into the school.
- When in classroom, introduce yourself and tell them about your connection to agriculture. After reading and doing the activity, if you chose to, be sure to leave the book and educators guide with the teacher.

Zoom Reading:

- Set up your free Zoom account and send the link to your teacher. For instructions on setting up a Zoom account visit our website at www.pfb.com/agliteracy and click on the Volunteer Info tab.
- Make arrangements to get the book and educator's guide to the classroom teacher after you have read the book.
