Farm Charm

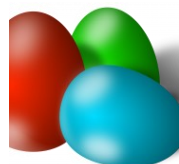
Every single person on Earth is involved in Agriculture! They could be a consumer or a producer.



A consumer is someone who uses agricultural products. When you ate your cereal this morning or your scrambled eggs, you were a consumer because you ate a piece of agriculture.

A producer is someone who raises and grows agriculture products. If you own the chickens that laid the eggs for those scrambled eggs; or you farm the grain fields that make the cereal, you are a producer.

Grow Your Own Egghead

|--------------------|---------------------|
| 3 pine cones | Potting soil |
| 1 empty egg carton | 3 small flower pots |
| Grass seed | Bowl of water |

What to do:

1. Mix 2 Cups of potting soil with 2 Tablespoons of grass seeds.
2. Quickly dip pine cones in bowl of water.
3. Roll each pine cone in the potting soil and grass seed mix.
4. Place your pine cone upright in the egg carton.
5. Take your 3 small flower pots and draw faces on them.
6. Fill flower pots $\frac{3}{4}$ full of potting soil.
7. When your pine cones are getting fuzzy with grass replant them in the flower pots. Make a hole and place the pine cone in it and cover with soil.
