Soybeans can be found all over the world! Soybeans originated in Eastern Asia. Typically, each soybean pod contains 2 or 3 beans. Soybeans don't grow very tall. In fact, you are most likely taller than a soybean plant!

The United States grows more soybeans than any other country in the world. As a result, the United States exports soybeans to many different countries. In Japan, soybeans are used to make soy sauce. Soy sauce is a common ingredient in most Japanese food. If you are making soy sauce using the traditional method, it can be a very long process. Sometimes it can take up to a year to make one batch of soy sauce. In Taiwan, soybeans are used to make a different, more smelly kind of food...stinky toful People that are from Taiwan call stinky tofu *choudoufu*. The taste of stinky tofu is similar to swiss cheese.

Soybeans can be used for products other than food too. Egypt uses soybeans from the United States to make fish food. Aquaculture, or fish farming, is a large industry in Egypt. The country is the second largest producer of tilapia, a fish you can find in your grocery store. In addition, Argentina, a country in South America, turns soybeans from the United States into biodiesel. Biodiesel is a fuel than can be used to power vehicles and is renewable resource.
