That's over 60 percent of Pennsylvania! Over 25,000 miles of waterways run through Pennsylvania's forests and they are home to all sorts of plants and animals.

When people think about forests, one of the first things that pop into their heads is trees. There are so many different kinds of trees in the world, and

Make a Leaf Collection

Materials:

- Wax paper
- Towel
- Iron
- Scissors



- Scrapbook
- Tape
- LEAVES!

Steps:

- 1. Go to a state park or forest near your house and find some different kinds of leaves.
- 2. Put the leaf in between two pieces of wax paper.
- 3. Cover the wax paper with a towel and iron it.
- 4. Let the leaf and paper cool down.
- 5. Cut your wax paper to the size you want and then tape it in your i scrapbook.
- 6. Use the characteristics of the leaves to identify and label them.
- 7. Do steps 2-6 again with your other leaves to build up your collection!
